

An informal consultation about our proposal to increase the number of places at Brookfield School, Fouldrey Avenue, Poulton-le-Fylde, Lancashire, FY6 7HE through expansion of the school site.

November 2024

This is an informal consultation about making a prescribed alteration to a school in accordance with The School Organisation (Prescribed Alterations to Maintained Schools) (England) Regulations 2013.

We are seeking your initial views about our proposal to expand Brookfield School, Fouldrey Avenue, Poulton-le-Fylde, Lancashire, FY6 7HE, and whether you think this is a good idea. We are proposing to increase the number of special school places by 45, by creating additional classroom space on the school site.

This is an initial informal consultation we are carrying out as part of the process to make a change like this to a school.

We want to assure you that we will give careful consideration to all your comments and opinions. We will use your feedback to develop our proposal ready to take to the next stage of formal consultation.

This is a legal requirement in order to make changes like this to a school.

What are we planning to do?

Brookfield School is a special school for pupils aged 11-16 with social, emotional and mental health needs. The proposal is to expand the school, increasing the number of places by 45.

Why are we doing this?

All special schools in Lancashire are over-subscribed and there continues to be an increase in the need for special school places throughout the County.

Brookfield School is a 'good' school (Ofsted).

How will we do this?

By creating additional places on Brookfield School site.

Children already on the roll at Brookfield School will still be able to attend the school and should not experience any increase in class size because of the increase to the approved numbers. The school will receive additional funding from the high needs block to provide support for any additional pupils who join the school. This is in line with the funding for places at specialist schools. This means the school should not be financially disadvantaged by the proposed expansion.

What have we done so far?

We have considered the options for increasing the number of special school places in the North of the County with the headteachers of the special schools.

We have discussed this proposal with the headteacher and governors of Brookfield School.

What will happen next?

Careful consideration will be given to all responses that are received on or before 22nd November 2024.

These responses will be used to inform us how to develop this proposal, ready for a formal consultation that is needed to make a change like this to a school.






